*If pressed for time, and only have time to ask 3 questions, use the short intercept interview guide which is included at the end of this document.

Questions

- 1. What do you think about the cover? What about it might make you want to look at it further?
- 2. What are points that are easy to understand? What parts are not clear?
- 3. What are your first reactions to the images (pictures, artwork, graphs, etc.)? How well do they fit the messages?
- 4. What audience do you think this material is appropriate for?
- 5. What did you like about the material?
- 6. Is there anything you did not like about the material? If so, what?
- 7. What are some ways the material could be improved?
- 8. After reading/reviewing the material, what was the most memorable part?
- 9. What are one or two key messages that you recall from the material?
- 10. What would this material encourage you to do?
- 11. Do you have any other comments?
